There has recently been some confusion surrounding QuickStart Tennis lines on regulation-sized tennis courts. Specifically, whether or not USTA matches can be played on these courts. Please see the official USTA ruling on this matter below for clarification:

The Rules of Tennis **do allow** USTA National/Sectional/District events or tournaments to be played on courts with additional lines, such as those used for the QuickStart Tennis format.

However, the rules **prohibit** play on courts with additional lines for ITF (International Tennis Federation) and ITA (Intercollegiate Tennis Association) events or tournaments.

Facilities interested in putting permanent QuickStart Tennis lines on existing courts or building permanent QuickStart Tennis courts are welcome to contact the USTA for technical assistance at technical@usta.com.
